NC State University is an inclusive campus that welcomes and encourages diversity and respects the inherent worth of each member of our community. In order to successfully adhere to this principle, NC State works to continually demonstrate its commitment to equal opportunity and its position against discrimination, harassment, and retaliation.

NC State's Discrimination and Harassment Prevention and Response (DHPR) Training Regulation (Reg 04.25.06) **requires** that all university employees participate in an approved DHPR training program at least once every five (5) years. Most NC State employees are exposed to an approved DHPR training program during New Employee Orientation; any employee who was hired or completed an approved DHPR program prior to January 2009 is due to complete the program again.

To help employees meet this requirement, training options to meet one's work and learning styles are available. A new DHPR online module can be accessed through the Office for Institutional Equity and Diversity website. In-person classroom workshops are also offered.
